Trouble in Spain and Portugal

The Spanish Inquisition started in 1478. King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella wanted everyone to believe in the Catholic religion. Jews living in Spain were told to either become a Christian and get baptised or leave Spain. People were burnt alive in front of large crowds if they were caught practising Judaism in secret. Many Jews fled to Portugal but they were not safe there for long as the Portuguese Monarchy started their own inquisition.

Jews from Spain and Portugal were expelled, fled or forcibly converted. Some travelled to London to start new lives. Jews with a Spanish or Portuguese heritage are called **SEPHARDI**

FORCED CONVERSION

Being forced to change your religion or beliefs to a different religion or belief.

HERETIC

A person whose beliefs are considered wrong because they are different to what is accepted by most people.

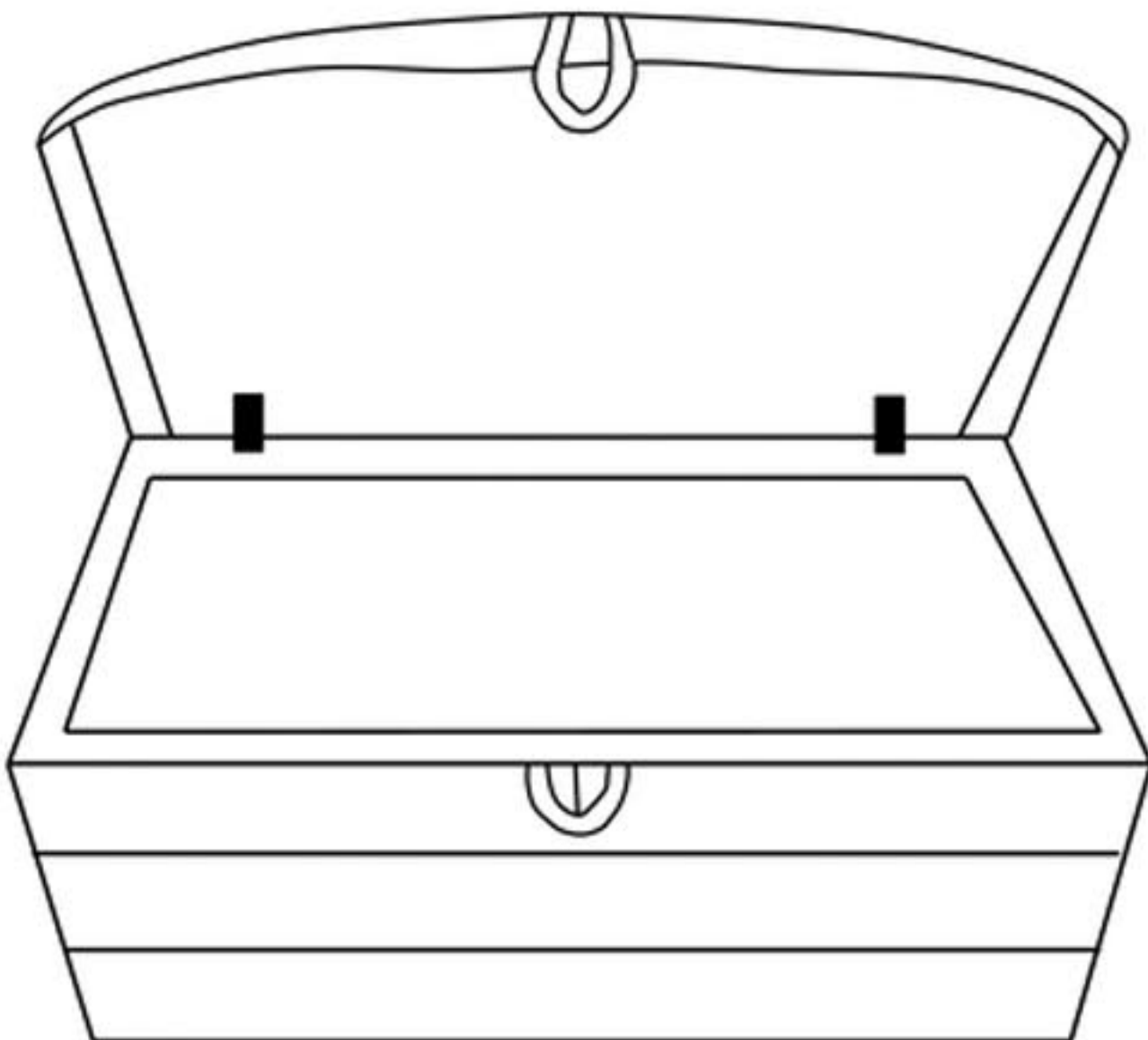

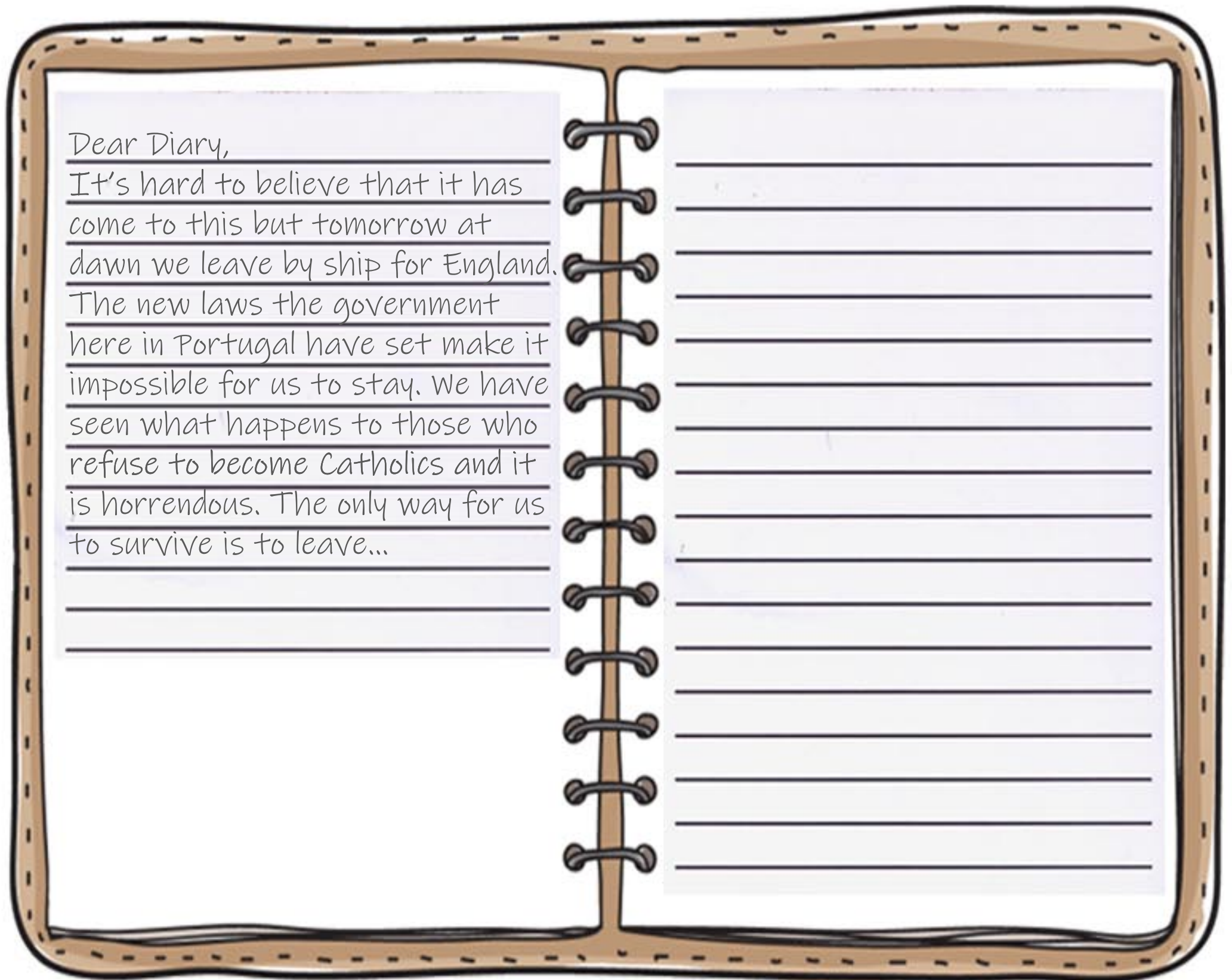

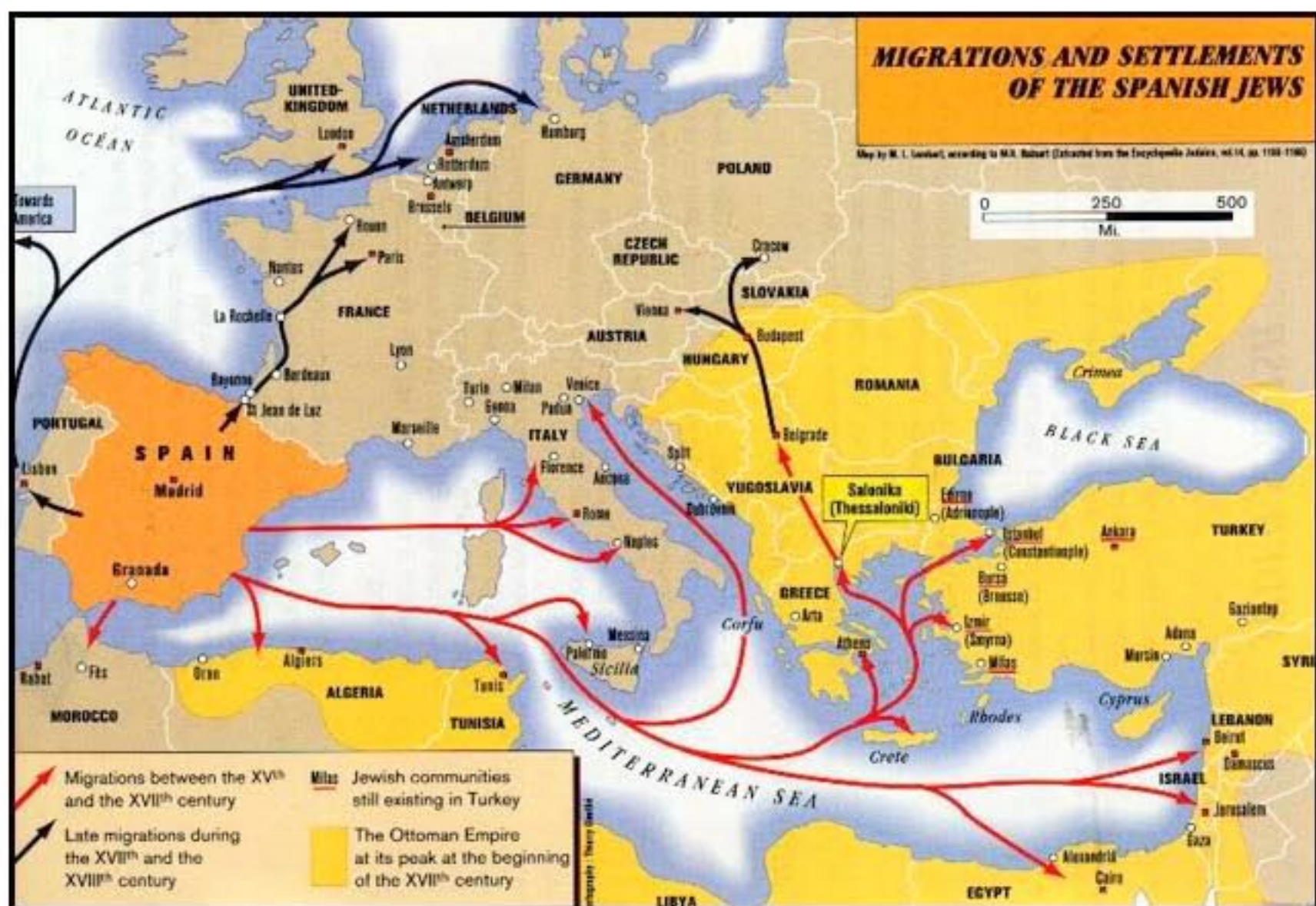

The Journey

From the end of the 15th Century Sephardi Jews travelled from Spain and Portugal to many different countries. These refugees journeyed over land, and some escaped by sea. These Jews took their Judeo-Iberian culture with them. Look at the map below and trace the journeys made to different countries. Can you find the route that took Sephardi Jews to England?



IBERIAN PENINSULA

The South West part of Europe, mainly Spain and Portugal.

LADINO

Ladino is a language once commonly spoken by Sephardim whose ancestors fled Spain. It is also called Judeo - Spanish.

People travelling to a new place to live.

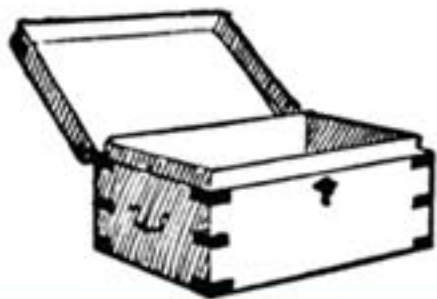


The Journey

Mark out your journey from Spain to London on the map below. Write a paragraph about the journey.











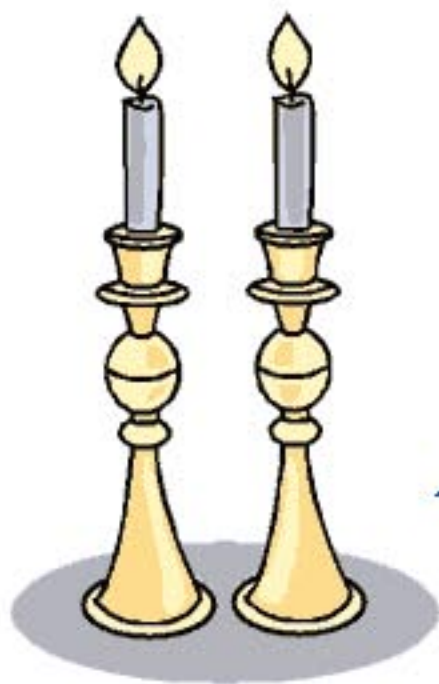

Hiding and Secrecy

A group of Sephardi Jewish merchants arrived in London from Spain and Portugal in the 17th Century. They lived as Marranos or Crypto Jews. This meant that they outwardly lived as Christians but still practised Judaism in secret. Crypto Jews were unable to tell outsiders that they were Jewish. Parts of the City of London became home to a secret and hidden community made up of several Jewish merchants and their families.

Despite the danger of being found out, Crypto Jews in London continued to meet and perform Jewish rituals in secret. Many even attended Mass at the Chapel of the Spanish Ambassador

MERCHANT

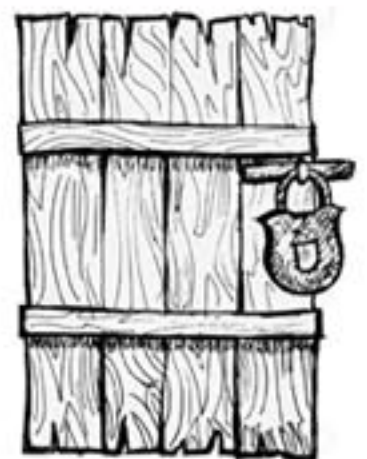
A person who buys and sells goods especially on a large scale or with foreign countries.

CRYPTO-JEW

A Jew who converted to Christianity to escape persecution but continued to practise Judaism secretly.

CLANDESTINE

Something hidden or kept secret, often because it is illegal.

Oliver Cromwell

Oliver Cromwell was Lord Protector and a military and political leader in England. In March 1656 a group of Sephardi Jews, led by Menasseh Ben Israel, signed a petition asking Cromwell for permission to hold Jewish services and to lease land for a Jewish cemetery. Oliver Cromwell gave this group of Jewish merchants permission to meet for prayers in their private houses and to get land for a cemetery in East London.

LORD PROTECTOR

A formal written request given to people in positions of power.

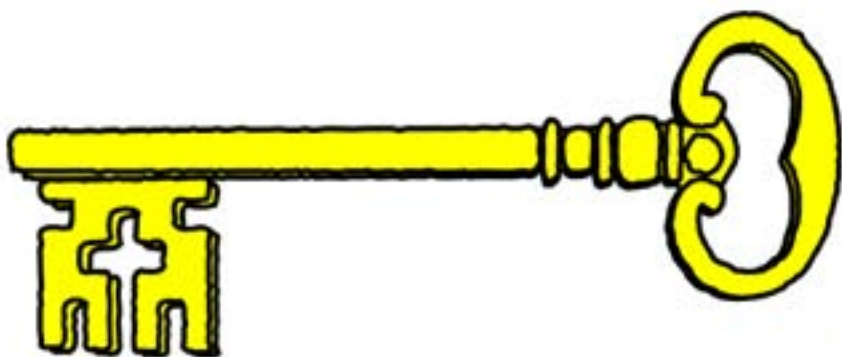

The Novo Cemetery

Without their own cemetery Jews in London had to be buried in Christian graveyards. The first Sephardi Jewish burial ground opened in 1657 and was called the Velho cemetery. When this cemetery became full the Novo cemetery opened and the first burials took place there in 1733. The Novo cemetery can still be visited today and is located in the grounds of Queen Mary University in Mile End.

The Novo Cemetery is filled with flat gravestones without any upright memorials. This is to represent the equality of all people in death. Families are often buried together in the same row.



Carved hands on graves show where descendants of Aharon (older brother of Moses) are buried.
